Annex B: Local Authority Level Learning Disability Statistics Scotland (2014)

This Annex provides information about adults with learning disabilities known to local authorities, at local authority level.

Any comparisons between the data provided by local authorities should take account of local populations, priorities and geographical circumstances, as well as data quality issues, for example non-response error, which have been flagged where appropriate. In particular, data users should be mindful of missing data across the individual data items. The statistical producer team is working closely in partnership with local authorities to progressively improve the data recorded, collected and published about adults with learning disabilities.

Tables B1a-c: Adults with learning disabilities known to local authorities in 2014

These figures include adults with learning disabilities who are known to local authorities from contact in the last 3 years. The figures include 16 and 17 year olds who are not in full-time education. Adults known to local authorities are not necessarily receiving a service. Adults who have been assessed for a service but refused a service should still appear in this statistical return.

This data does not include adults with learning disabilities who are not known to local authority areas. Please see the data quality summary in Annex C, published alongside this Statistical Return on August 12th 2015 for further information.

Edinburgh City Council reported the highest number of adults with learning disabilities known (3,520 adults), followed by Glasgow City Council (2,306 adults – please see Note 1 below). Orkney Islands Council, an island council, reported the lowest number of adults with learning disabilities known (93 adults).

There are 6.0 adults with learning disabilities known to local authorities per 1,000 of the population in Scotland. At local authority level, this ranges from 3.7 adults with learning disabilities per 1,000 of the population in Perth and Kinross to 9.5 adults with learning disabilities per 1,000 of the population in Dundee City.

Notes

1. Glasgow City Council and North Lanarkshire Council only returned information on adults with learning disabilities who are in receipt of a service funded by the local authority, rather than those who are known to the local authority, as this is the information which can be extracted from their Management Information Systems. Data users should be aware that the number of adults with learning disabilities in these local authorities and the total number recorded nationally are therefore likely to be an under-estimate. Of the remaining, 29 local authorities returned data as stipulated in the 2014 Data Guidance document. East Renfrewshire Council did not return any data for the 2014

collection. As a result, to maintain national relevance, the 2013 data supplied by this authority has been used.

2. There are 944 adults (3.5%) included in the Statistical Return who are on the autism spectrum and do not have an associated learning disability.
3. SCLD takes all possible steps to avoid duplicate records appearing in the Statistical Return, including data cleansing and checking processes. However, duplication of records for individuals is possible when a person is funded by one local authority but lives and/or receives services in another. Data guidance states that the local authority which provides the majority of funding for an individual should return data on that individual. Where it is unclear which local authority provides the majority of funding, local authorities work together during data collection to minimise duplication of records. It is possible that there may be duplicate records within the statistical return but SCLD statistical producer team estimates that this will be a very small proportion of the total, given that numbers of adults with learning disabilities living in a local authority different to that which funds a service for them are low.
4. Age in 2014 is calculated from year of birth. Date of birth is not collected to maintain confidentiality.
5. There are 6 adults whose year of birth has not been recorded. They have been included in the totals column for number of adults known to local authorities.
6. These figures are likely to be an under-estimate of the true number of 16 and 17 year olds with learning disabilities, as they do not include 16 and 17 year olds who are in full-time education.

Table B2: Adults who are on the autism spectrum (AS) by local authority area in 2014

These figures show adults with learning disabilities and/or on the autism spectrum known to local authorities in Scotland. The data include people 16 and 17 years old and not in full time education.

Some adults who are on the autism spectrum also have learning disabilities.

Some adults who are on the autism spectrum do not have learning disabilities. These figures are likely to represent a significant under-estimate of the total number of adults on the autism spectrum in Scotland. This is due to a number of factors:

- Only adults known to local authorities who have received a formal medical diagnosis of being on the autism spectrum are included within this Statistical Return;
- Some adults on the autism spectrum will not have, or will not wish to have, any formal support;
- Some adults on the autism spectrum will access support through the NHS or other organisations, and therefore may not be known to local authorities;
- Local authorities may not be aware that an adult is on the autism spectrum;
- Local authority recording of whether an adult is on the autism spectrum can be patchy;
- Services such as local area co-ordination may work with adults on the autism spectrum when no other department of the local authority does so. This may lead to sample bias in some local authority areas.

However, these figures do provide further information about adults on the autism spectrum who are known to local authority learning disability services.

All local authorities returned data on adults with an autism spectrum diagnosis. Thirteen local authorities returned information on all individuals known to them on this data item.

4,048 adults known to local authorities in Scotland are recorded as being on the autism spectrum. This is 15.1% of all adults known to local authorities in Scotland.

Edinburgh City Council reported the highest number of adults with an autism spectrum diagnosis (419 adults) but also have the largest number of adults known to them. East Dunbartonshire Council reported the largest proportion of adults with an autism diagnosis as a proportion of all adults with learning disabilities known to them (30.8%).

Notes:

1. 31 local authorities returned data as stipulated in the 2014 Data Guidance document. East Renfrewshire Council did not return any data for the 2014 collection. As a result, to maintain national relevance, the 2013 data supplied by this authority has been used.
2. Information on this data item was not recorded for 4,478 adults with learning disabilities (16.7% of all adults known to local authorities). Missing data has not been imputed. Data users should be aware that the number of adults on the autism spectrum and those who do not have a diagnosis, are therefore likely to be higher than reported.
3. Highland Council recorded all adults with an autism spectrum diagnosis known in the area as having an 'other autism spectrum diagnosis' which may reflect a processing, measurement or coding error or may relate to the way in which the local Management Information System captures the data.

Table B3: Adults with learning disabilities who live with a family carer by local authority area in 2014

These figures include adults with learning disabilities who are known to local authorities from contact in the last 3 years. The figures include 16 and 17 year olds who are not in full-time education.

In total, information on this item was not recorded for 5,075 adults with learning disabilities across Scotland. Missing data has not been imputed. Data users should be aware that both the number of adults with learning disabilities who live with a family carer and those who do not live with a family carer is therefore likely to be higher than the figure reported.

Family carer information is not known for just under three quarters (72.1%) of adults with learning disabilities in Aberdeenshire Council.

Over a third (34.7%) of adults with learning disabilities known to local authorities were reported as living with a family carer.

Comhairle nan Eilean Siar reported the highest proportion of adults with learning disabilities living with a family carer, at 76.7%.

Table B4: Adults with learning disabilities living in the same accommodation by local authority area in 2014

These figures include adults with learning disabilities who are known to local authorities from contact in the last 3 years. The figures include 16 and 17 year olds who are not in full-time education.

Overall, there were 5,742 people for whom this data was not known by local authorities. Missing data has not been imputed. Data users should be aware that both the number of adults with learning disabilities living as the only person with learning disabilities in their accommodation and the number of adults living with other people with learning disabilities in the same accommodation may be higher, both at local authority level and at national level.

54.7% of adults with learning disabilities known to local authorities were the only person with learning disabilities in their accommodation. 23.8% of adults with learning disabilities known to local authorities live with **at least** one other person with learning disabilities.

1. Aberdeenshire Council, Clackmannanshire Council and North Lanarkshire Council did not return any data for this item. Of the remaining, 28 local authorities returned data as stipulated in the 2014 Data Guidance document. East Renfrewshire Council did not return any data for the 2014 collection. As a result, to maintain national relevance, the 2013 data supplied by this authority has been used.

Table B5: Accommodation type for adults with learning disabilities by local authority area in 2014

These figures include adults with learning disabilities who are known to local authorities from contact in the last 3 years. The figures include 16 and 17 year olds who are not in full-time education.

Information on accommodation type was known for 23,356 adults with learning disabilities known to services (89.0% of all adults). However, no information was recorded on this data item for 2,603 (9.7%) adults with learning disabilities known to services. Missing data has not been imputed. Data users should be aware that the total number of adults living in mainstream accommodation, supported accommodation, registered adult care home and 'other' accommodation types is likely to be higher than recorded.

Aberdeenshire Council did not return information on just under three quarters (67.5%) of adults with learning disabilities known to them for this item.

16,161 (60.3%) adults with learning disabilities known to local authorities were living in mainstream accommodation. 4,703 (17.6%) adults with learning disabilities known to local authorities were living in supported accommodation. 1,964 (7.3%) adults with learning disabilities known to local authorities were living in registered adult care homes.

This information is recorded for 19,710 (73.6%) adults with learning disabilities known to local authorities. However, information is not recorded for 7,076 (26.4%) adults with learning disabilities known to local authorities. Missing data has not been imputed. Data users should be aware that the totals across the data item are likely to be higher as a result.

Edinburgh City Council did not return information for 97.3% of adults with learning disabilities known to them on this data item. Non-recorded information on adults with learning disabilities known to Edinburgh City Council accounts for nearly half (48.4%) of the unrecorded information on this item.

Just over half (58.0%) of all adults with learning disabilities known to local authorities have a personal life plan. Around one in six (14.7%) adults with learning disabilities known to local authorities are reported not to have a personal life plan. There are 0.8% of all adults with learning disabilities for whom a personal life plan is not applicable; this is usually because the adult has not been asked whether or not they would like to have a personal life plan.

Data users should be aware of the limitations of this data. Individual level data on advocacy have large amounts of missing data for a variety of reasons. First, it may not be appropriate or desirable for advocacy organisations to share data about individuals with learning disabilities with local authorities, especially if the individual requires some support with an issue relating to the local authority. Second, there may be difficulties with matching data provided by advocacy organisations. Third, local authorities and advocacy organisations may not have data sharing agreements in place. Fourth, a given adult's advocacy requirements or status may not be routinely collected by local authorities. Missing data has not been imputed.

There were 12 local authorities did not report on individual advocacy level data. Data on advocacy status were recorded for 8,544 (31.9%) adults with learning disabilities known to local authorities. Information on advocacy status was not recorded for 5,426 (20.3%) adults with learning disabilities known to local authorities.
