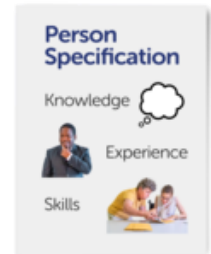




Information about the Rapporteur Role

To be a Rapporteur you need to be someone who has a learning disability



You need to be passionate about making Scotland a better place for people with learning disabilities to live their best life



You need to be passionate about **Human Rights**

Human Rights are the basic rights and freedoms that belong to every person in the world



These basic rights are based on **dignity, fairness, equality, respect and independence**



Having your rights respected means that no one should stop you from having your human rights



You need to have experience of working with other people and groups



You need to be someone who can show how they are a leader



You need to be someone who can talk to lots of different people

You need to be someone who can listen well



You need to be someone who can ask questions



You need to be someone who would like to speak at meetings and conferences



You need to be available to attend training workshops and different meetings

You need to have the time to involved for the next 2 years
