The course is limited to 10 participants to foster working together.



A short informal interview takes place with participants before the course



A facilitator is present in every session to collect observational data points.



All sessions are recorded on Zoom and are accessible for all participants.



Each participant has a sponsor who provides tips on how knowledge learnt can be put into practice.



Graduates of the first course can support and contribute to subsequent courses.



There is a Learning Log to accompany the course where feedback from participants/sponsors is recorded after each module using emojis to rate the module This feedback can be written or videoed.



Participants are asked to do some work before and after each session to embed their learning. A workbook is provided with all relevant course material.

After finishing the programme, one participant has decided that she wants to become "a teaching assistant and work with children with additional support needs"

Our Future Leaders is a groundbreaking programme delivered over Zoom and involving 12 half-day sessions, led by expert external facilitators and developed by Inspiring Scotland and SCLD.

The aim of the programme is to empower and support people with learning/intellectual disabilities to develop practical leadership skills. Throughout the sessions, participants develop skills in communication, confidence, and self-awareness.

Sessions focus on practical skills, where learning is further embedded by the participants' sponsor. Real time feedback is taken into account continuously in order to ensure that the course is meeting the needs and requirements of the participants.
