





Step 1

Making sure people with learning disabilities lead culture change

Step 2

Making sure the new Human Rights Bill for Scotland respects the rights in the convention on the rights of persons with disabilities

Step 3

Making sure learning disability and autism are removed from the definition of *'mental disorder'* under the Mental Health Care and Treatment Act
